Introduction to the Celebration

Motivation

Let us give thanks to the Lord for the witness of life and dedication of our Amigonian brothers through martyrdom and holiness, which are part of the vocation of all believers. We ask ourselves, where did they find the strength, the courage, to prefer death rather than renounce their faith in God? First, in the fact that the Lord does not abandon those He calls, and second, in the conviction that "the martyrs knew Jesus deeply, loved Him dearly, with all their hearts." Introduction to the Celebration

The word "martyrdom" derives from the Greek martyria, which precisely means testimony. However, "very soon in the Church, the word martyr was used to indicate someone who bore witness even to the point of shedding their blood." The core and source of martyrdom is not a burst of religious heroism but a "mystery of love," a dynamic entirely woven with "gratuitousness and gratitude" for the gifts of salvation freely received from Christ.

In the context of the Month of Amigonianity, today we celebrate the Feast of our Blessed Capuchin Tertiary

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Sisters: Rosario of Soano, Serafina of Ochovi, and Francisca of Rafelbuñol, Martyrs of the Spanish Civil War.

The testimony of their simple and coherent lives in the midst of everyday life should lead us to reflect on how we Christian life, whether Laypeople live our as or Consecrated persons, all called to Holiness: "Be holy, for your Heavenly Father is holy." The heroism and way of life of these Sisters of ours calls us to live our Baptismal Consecration with joy and authenticity, being witnesses of God's love and mercy. Let us begin this celebration by singing.

INITIAL ADDRESS

The martyrial witness of our Sisters Rosario, Serafina, and Francisca gives us a glimpse into the experience of faith that inspired them to give their lives for the cause of Jesus and the Kingdom of God. They were blessed because they centered their lives on Christ, and from Him, they served and loved to the point of giving their lives for LIFE.

Setting:

On a day like this, Father Luis surrendered his life to God, who welcomed him into His dwelling of light and eternal life. Tonight, we want to remember that moment he lived with extreme serenity, listening to the account of his holy death and allowing ourselves to be touched by his example. Let us begin this celebration.

Song: Father Luis, All Your Children

Reader: Worn out by eighty years of life, filled with work, penance, and concerns, the Bishop fell ill during the



summer. Hoping to improve, he moved to Masamagrell, living in the rooms prepared for him by the Sisters at the Motherhouse. However, the Tertiary Religious, including the Most Reverend Father General, became convinced that, unfortunately, the life of their Holy Founder was like a light that was fading. They decided to bring him to Godella, the headquarters of the Congregation, to have the comfort of caring for him during his final days. The patient had lost his sight and asked for permission from the Holy See to celebrate a votive Mass of the Virgin because it was extremely painful for him to miss celebrating Mass even for a single day. Realizing that the end of his life was near, he received the news with the equanimity that characterized him, confident in the goodness of his actions.

LOOKING AT MYSELF THROUGH YOU

*Look at me, Jesus of Nazareth.

May I feel your gaze upon me, a gaze that is free, without the bondage of the synagogue, without demands that ignore me, without the distance that chills, without the greed that buys me.

*May Your gaze rest upon my senses and filter into the inaccessible corners where my unknown self, sown by You from my beginning, awaits You, and may it germinate my future, silently breaking through with the green of its leaves the hardened earth that buries and nourishes me.

*Let me enter into You, to see myself through You, and feel the dissolving of so many of my own and others' gazes that deform and break me.

Reader:

That holy religious man who spent his entire life preparing to die well could not fear the final moments of his life; that

Holy Founder, who was a school of perfection for his Religious, who had prepared alongside his bed the coffin and the garments in which he would be shrouded, could not tremble at the hour of death. The great Bishop, who had won the love of all his flock, who a hundred times a day, kneeling before a crucifix, kissing its feet and weeping, exclaimed: "Remember, compassionate Jesus, since I am the cause of your coming, not to lose me on that day." Therefore, upon hearing the fatal news, with Christian strength and the faith of one who knows the victory is won, he said:

Father Luis: "I want to receive the Holy Viaticum to pass into a better life."

Reader: This was an emotional and sublime act. His Divine Majesty was carried under a canopy by Dr. Lauzurica, Auxiliary Bishop of Valencia; numerous religious from the two Congregations founded by the patient attended, with lit candles, led by the Superior General, Father Ildefonso of Vall Uxó, and the Superior General, Sister Genoveva of Valencia; the Vicar General and Chancellor of the Diocese of Segorbe, the very illustrious gentlemen Don Marcelino Blasco and Don Romualdo Amigó; the parish priests of Godella and neighboring towns, the family, and several close friends of the patient, as well as representatives the Capuchin communities of Valencia and from Masamagrell.

The moment of the Viaticum was emotional. The Bishop of Segorbe was seated in a chair, dressed in a surplice and stole. First, with great fervor and full awareness, he made the profession of faith and again requested sacramental absolution. With tears in his eyes and signs of deep emotion, he forgave and asked forgiveness from all, whom he blessed at the end of the heartfelt act. The Vicar General of Segorbe administered the sacrament of Extreme Unction to the ailing Bishop. Amid tears and deep reverence, this emotional act of everlasting memory concluded.

When the Auxiliary Bishop took his leave, he offered words of comfort and strength, assuring the venerable patient that his good works had earned him a great reward in glory. The venerable patient took his hands, and thanking him for his charity, kissed them, saying:

Father Luis: "Bishop, I am nothing but a sinner."

Bishop: "You are what God knows, and so do we."

Reader: Deeply moved, the Bishop kissed the dying man's hands and withdrew, saying:

Bishop: "He is a saint, he is a saint."

THE NEW EARTH

*In the new earth, houses have no keys, and walls do not divide the world; no one is alone.

Reader: On October 1st, the telegraph announced that Father Luis Amigó, Bishop of Segorbe, had peacefully passed away at the residence in Godella, surrounded by his Tertiary sons, who were deeply saddened by such an





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irreparable loss.

[While the song is sung, the participants will light their candles from the candle in front of the portrait or bust of Father Luis, and when all the candles are lit, the large candle will be extinguished.]

Reader: The body, dressed in pontifical attire and watched over by the Religious, was exposed in the church.

Immediately, the Archbishop of Valencia and his Auxiliary arrived, praying before the deceased, expressing their condolences to the community, and offering to officiate the funeral rites that were organized. Other ecclesiastical and civil authorities, as well as a large part of the population, passed by the residence visibly moved by the loss. The Apostolic Nuncio, many prelates, and entities sent heartfelt telegrams of condolence, praising the merits of the deceased.

The next day, the first funeral was held, officiated by the Most Reverend Father General of the Capuchin Tertiaries. In the afternoon, the body was transferred to the prioral church of Masamagrell, where it was received by the Auxiliary Bishop, the parish clergy, the communities of the Capuchins of Magdalena, the Tertiaries, and the entire town, mourning their illustrious compatriot.

Without a Shroud

Whoever says God is dead, come out into the light and see whether the world is or is not the work of a God who remains awake. His place is no longer the desert, nor does He hide on the mountain; tell, if they ask where He is, that God is without a shroud wherever a man works and a heart responds to Him.







On October 3rd, the pontifical funeral was celebrated by the Archbishop of Valencia, assisted by his canons. The Mass was sung by the seraphic choir of the Capuchins and Tertiaries. Religious and civil representatives attended, too numerous to mention in detail; among them were the community of Capuchins of Magdalena and the Very Reverend Provincial Father of the Capuchins of Valencia and Andalusia; the entire General Government of the Tertiaries, with more than thirty Religious; the Superior General of the Tertiaries, accompanied by about forty Religious Sisters.

Then the body was transported to the church of the Capuchin Tertiary Sisters, where it was to be finally buried.

On October 4th, the burial funeral was celebrated by the Very Reverend Provincial Father of the Capuchins of Andalusia, presided over by the Auxiliary Bishop. Immediately afterward, the funeral procession was formed.

As we contemplate Father Luis clothed in new and eternal life, let us rejoice with him and feel him as a companion on our journey, just as we feel our dearest ones who have left us. Let us continue our task in this world with the faith, serenity, and strength that always characterized the life of Father Luis.

SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI

He was born in Assisi in 1182. Converted to Christ after a worldly youth, he renounced his father's wealth and dedicated himself entirely to God.

He embraced poverty and led an evangelical life, preaching to all the love of God. He formed his followers with exemplary rules of life, approved by the Apostolic See. He also founded the Order of Poor Clares and the Third Order of laypeople. He preached the faith among non-believers. He died on the evening of October 3, 1226.
